



## Noise will begin with bridge construction

Project staff are preparing for construction to start in January 2011. Work is expected to last one year. As part of the construction for the new pedestrian and bicycle bridge, there will be some night-time construction activity. This may result in increased noise during both the day and night.

**Night work will begin January 24<sup>th</sup>** and continue occasionally until the end of the project (scheduled for January 31, 2012). The initial night work will be **located along SW Hood Avenue** between the Ross Island Bridge and SW Curry/Hood intersection. Work will include equipment operations, material handling, and excavation. In an effort to reduce the impact to residents, noise levels will try to be kept to a lower volume after 11:00 pm.

## Work on the Gibbs Street Pedestrian Bridge begins!

The City of Portland is working to build a new bike and pedestrian bridge over I-5 to connect the historic Lair Hill neighborhood with the South Waterfront District. The bridge will span approximately 700 feet, and will have a landing on the west side near the intersection of SW Gibbs Street and SW Kelly Avenue and on the east side near the intersection of SW Gibbs Street and SW Moody Avenue. The bridge will be adjacent to the aerial tram and will include improvements to some pedestrian crossings in the area.

**Night work will begin January 24<sup>th</sup>** and continue occasionally until the end of the project.
